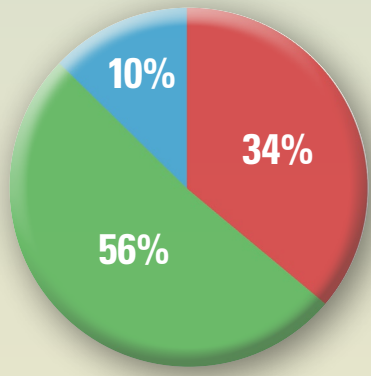
## IS MY HOSPITAL RURAL?

Rural hospitals are those not located within a metropolitan area designated by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget and the Census Bureau. of the decline in the number of U.S. community hospitals between 2017 and 2021 were **RURAL HOSPITALS**

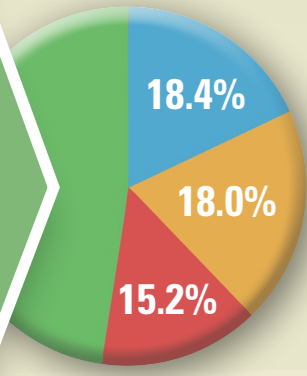


**48.4%**
